WHEREAS, the County has determined that all local agencies are required to utilize the County's Model Conflict of Interest Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Directors resolves as follows:

- 1. The Board hereby adopts the Conflict-of-Interest Code attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- 2. All prior resolutions regarding a Conflict-of-Interest Code are superseded and have no further force and effect.

CONFLICT-OF-INTEREST CODE FOR

Selma Kingsburg Fowler County Sanitation District

The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict-of-interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. Section 18730) that contains the terms of a standard conflict-of-interest code and may be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing, the standard code may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendices designating positions and establishing disclosure requirements shall constitute the conflict-of-interest code of the **Selma Kingsburg Fowler County Sanitation District (District)**.

The Form 700s for designated positions, other than the **District's Board of Directors**, **Alternates for the Board of Directors** and **General Manager**, shall be filed with the **District**. The **District's Board of Directors**, **Alternates for the Board of Directors and General Manger** are to file their original Form 700s directly with the Clerk of the Board for the Fresno County Board of Supervisors using the electronic filing system. If the Form 700s are not filed electronically, the paper Form 700 and waiver shall be filed with the **District** and, upon receipt of these paper Form 700s with waivers, the **District** shall make and retain a copy and forward the original to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

The **District** shall retain a copy of all electronically filed Form 700s, a copy of all paper Form 700s with waivers and the original Form 700s of designated positions and shall make the Form 700s available for public review, inspection, and reproduction. (Gov. Code section 81008.)

The provisions of all Conflict of Interest Codes and amendments thereto previously adopted by the Agency are hereby superseded.

SUBJECT

Request to authorize the Policy Advisory Committee (PAC) to explore the feasibility of using the storm water ponds located south of Kamm Avenue for groundwater recharge.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Board consider whether to authorize PAC to explore the feasibility of using the storm water ponds for groundwater recharge.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

At the July 3, 2024, PAC meeting PAC member Henderson requested a discussion regarding the potential use of the stormwater ponds south of Kamm Avenue for the purposes of groundwater recharge. Prior to agendizing this at a future PAC meeting staff wanted to get approval from the District Board to do so. There are many details, research, and discussion revolving around groundwater recharge, water rights, how it effects District state reporting requirements, and benefits. It is anticipated that the South Kings GSA will be conducting most of the work and the PAC will be providing input and recommendations for consideration by the District Board. District staff is requesting direction from the Board of Directors.

The District understands the importance of groundwater sustainability, benefit to the rate payer, member cities.

Background

The District treatment process includes evaporation/percolation ponds that provide recharge to the underlying groundwater subbasin. Currently, the storm water ponds south of Kamm Avenue are used by the City of Selma for storm water drainage. The District and Selma have an agreement dated January 1975 that allows for the use of said ponds. In reviewing the agreement, it may be terminated mutually or by the District. The City of Selma will need to decide on continuing using the storm water ponds. It is not clear on whether or not the storm water ponds may be used for both storm water and recharge. The District does not foresee the need for this area for wastewater purposes in the next 15-20 years.

WHEREAS, SELMA-KINGSBURG-FOWLER COUNTY SANITATION DISTRICT, hereinafter referred to as "District" and the CITY OF SELMA, hereinafter referred to as "City," have entered into various agreements with regard to sewage treatment and maintenance of City's sewage collection system; and

WHEREAS, City has, pursuant to said agreements, transferred certain property commonly known as the "Kamm Avenue drainage ponds," more specifically described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein, to District, said property hereinafter referred to as "Ponds"; and

WHEREAS, no provision has been made for the use of said Kamm Avenue drainage ponds by City for runoff from City's storm drainage system, which use was intended by both parties;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AND UNDERSTOOD BY AND BETWEEN THE DISTRICT AND CITY, as follows:

1. City may use Ponds for storm water drainage.

2. City shall not construct any improvements or make any changes or alterations from the present state without the written consent of District, except this shall not be construed to interfere with normal maintenance of the existing lines from City into said Ponds and such maintenance as is required to keep said Ponds in repair and available for storm water drainage purposes.

3. District makes no warranties, implied or actual, as to the suitability of Ponds for storm water drainage and assumes no liability for such use whatsoever. District has no requirement and is under no obligation to make Ponds suitable for storm water drainage purposes and District's inspection or use of Ponds in any way shall not and does not apply to the use for storm water drainage purposes by City.

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Agreement by District to maintenance and/or construction of facilities and improvements by City extends no warranty or suitability of purpose to said maintenance and/or construction of said facilities and improvements.

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4. All of the privileges and immunities from liability, exemptions from laws, ordinances and rules, all pension, relief, disability, Workmen's Compensation, and other benefits which apply to the activity of officers, agents or employees of the City when performing their respective functions within the territorial limits of the City, shall apply to them to the same degree and extent while engaged in the performance of any of their functions and duties within said Ponds.

5. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to limit, restrict, or abrogate any of the rights, duties, or obligations granted to or imposed upon City or District by law, and the provisions hereof shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the successors and assigns, respectively, of City and District.

6. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed to give City any ownership rights or any other right, title or interest in or to District's sanitary sewerage system and effluent, or any part thereof.

7. The entire obligation of District and City shall be as hereinabove set forth, and except as to claims related to the negligence of District or its officers, agents or employees, City shall in all other respects hold District free and harmless, and shall defend District against all claims or demands arising out of or connected with the use, improvement, maintenance and operation of Ponds by City under this Agreement.

That this Agreement shall become effective immediately and shall continue until termination by mutual consent or upon written notice by either party to the other party. If not by mutual consent, such notice by District to City shall be at least a one (1) year written notice and shall be exercised by District only in the one till to be

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are required by District for sewerage purposes and the use by City hereunder would prevent such use by District with no reasonable alternatives to District.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Due to California Air Resources Board Advanced Clean Fleet (ACF) requirements the District is required to purchase EVs for light duty vehicles under 10,000 GVWR. The ACF went into effect on January 1, 2024, and requires 50% of fleet purchases must be zero emission vehicles (ZEV). San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District is offering \$20,000 per gasoline vehicle replaced. SKFCSD Fleet vehicle V-06 Ford F150 (2004) is scheduled for replacement and meets requirements for grant funding.

The SJVAPCD grant application must be submitted and approved prior to the delivery of the vehicle. Funds are on a first come first serve basis. Funds are dispersed from SJVAPCD 60 days after vehicle is delivered and claim for payment is submitted by District. The District has a charging area for vehicle. The District is required to submit an annual report for three years.
